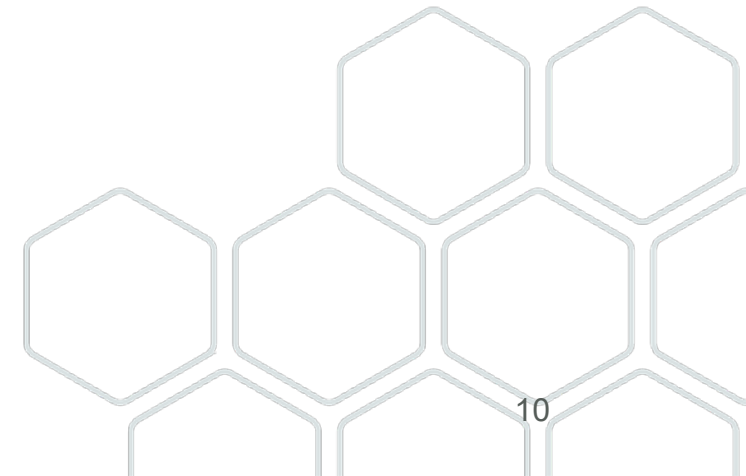

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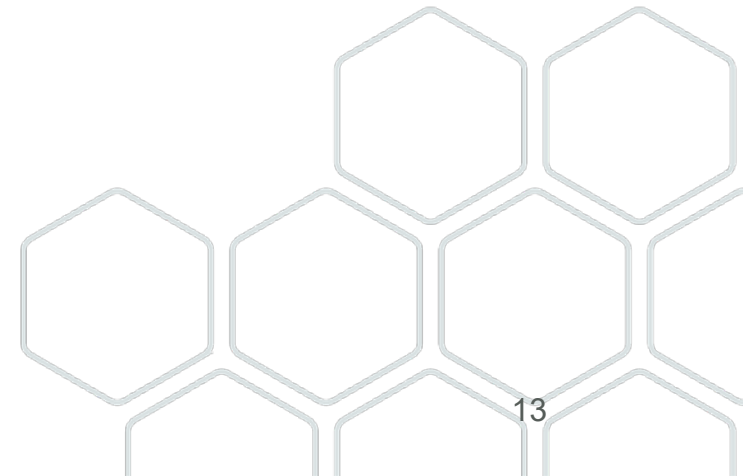
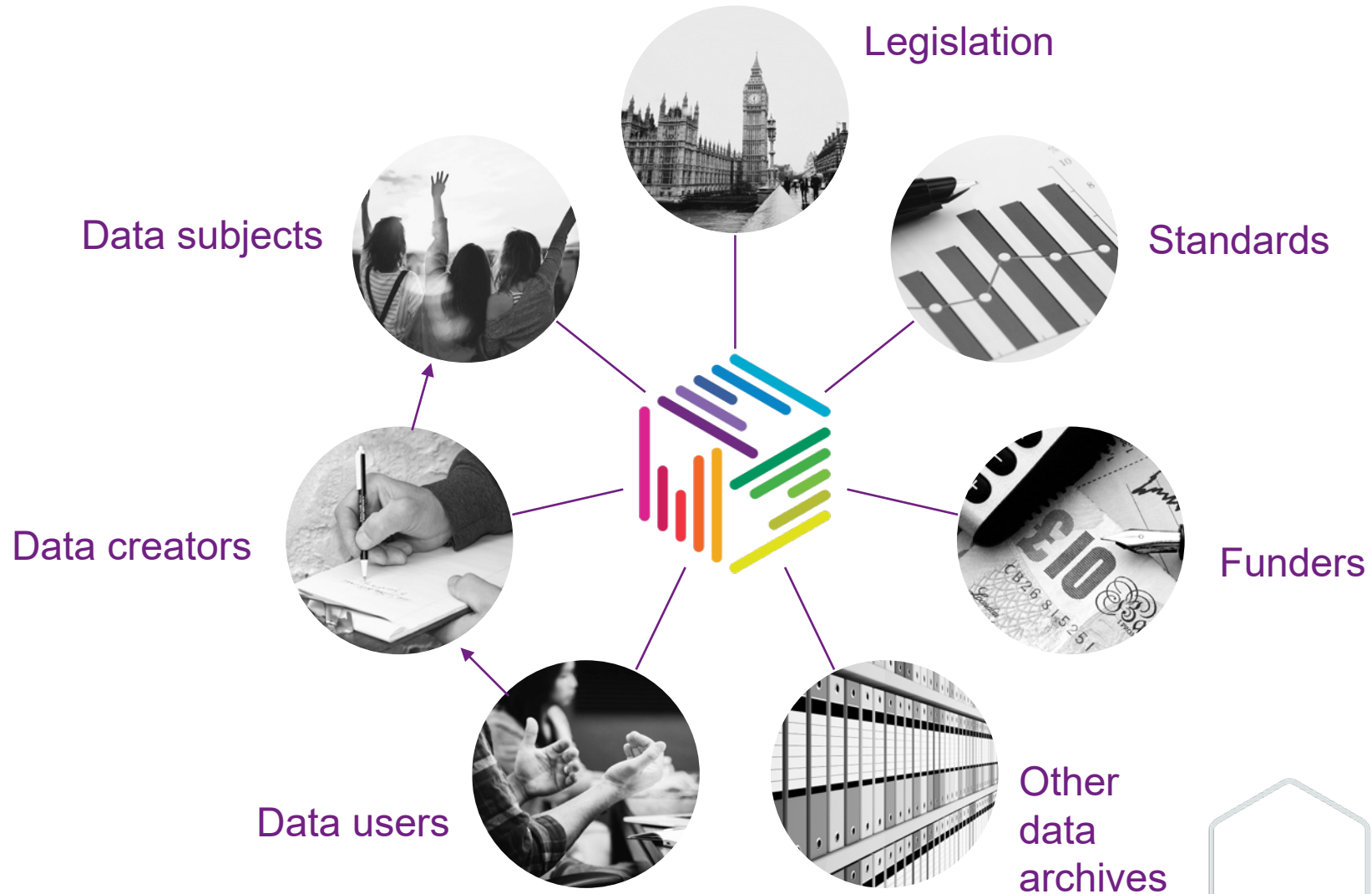
Our data resources cover decades of people's opinions and real, lived experiences.

New data acquisition

We worked closely with the Medical Research Council and Wellcome, culminating in the March 2020 report, *Clinical trial data sharing: what we've heard from researchers*.

80% in data collections deposited via our self-deposit repository and...

40% increase in curated collections in 2021, compared to 2020.

- **277** new studies added to our main collection
- **607** new studies to ReShare
- **2300** researchers used Understanding Society Covid-19 datasets
- **50** different countries had datasets collected
- **12,000** downloads completed
- **2700** projects registered as using these datasets.

Value and impact of training events

During the period of 1 April 2020 - 31 March 2022:

- **12,434** people attended events overall, compared to 5,601 previously
- **436** livestreams
- **228** training events hosted
- **54** events with training support provided
- **9** user conferences hosted
- **73** workshops hosted.

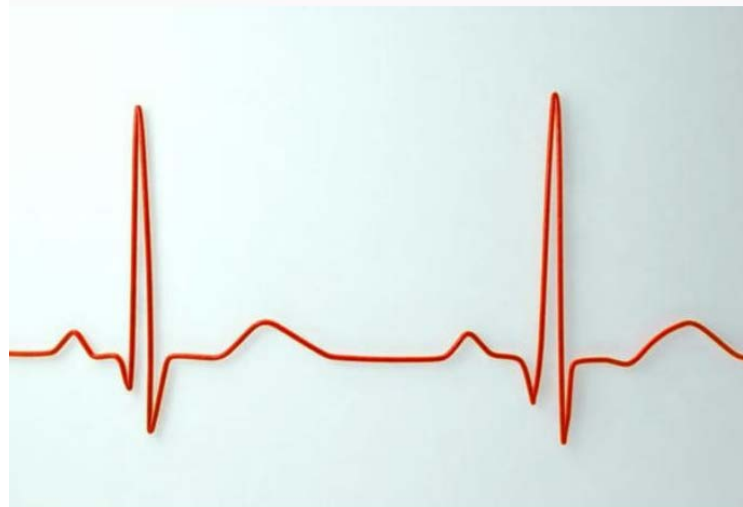
