Skills development has been identified as a priority need within the LPS community.


Commissioned to undertake an investigation into data management training provision focusing on wider data sharing.

Stats about UKDS

- ~ 9,700 data collections (1169 cohort and longitudinal studies)
- ~ 250 new data collections and new editions added each year
- ~ 48,000 registered users
- ~ 130,000 data accesses worldwide p.a

UKDS data collections are accessed every 6 minutes 24 x 7 x 365
