Open teaching data from key UK surveys

Our growing collection of open data can be downloaded and shared without restriction. The collection includes the following open teaching datasets based on major UK surveys.

SN 8850 British Social Attitudes Survey, 2019, Poverty and Welfare: Open Access Teaching Dataset

This teaching dataset has been created from the original British Social Attitudes Survey, 2019 (SN 8772), which interviewed 3,224 adults aged 18 and over. It has been adapted for teaching with a reduced number of variables on the theme of attitudes towards welfare and poverty.

SN 8849 British Social Attitudes Survey, 2017, Environment and Politics: Open Access Teaching Dataset

This teaching dataset has been created from the original British Social Attitudes Survey, 2019 (SN 8772), which interviewed 3,224 adults aged 18 and over. It has been adapted for teaching with a reduced number of variables on the theme of attitudes towards welfare and poverty.

SN 8786 <u>National Survey of Sexual Attitudes and Lifestyles, 2010-</u> 2012: Open Access Teaching Dataset

This open access teaching dataset contains data from the <u>original Natsal-3 study</u> which interviewed 15,162 adults aged 16-74 in 2010-2012. To make the data accessible for teaching via an open data licence, a subset of variables and cases has been selected. Some demographic variables have also been recoded and a new continuous variable measuring attitudes towards sexual behaviours (e.g., same-sex relationships, sex in the media) has been created. Other variables cover topics such as health/mental health, disability, relationship status and religion and religious beliefs.

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SN 7913 <u>Opinions and Lifestyle Survey, Well-Being Module, April -</u> May 2015: Unrestricted Access Teaching Dataset

This teaching dataset contains a sample of 2,048 cases with variables relating to subjective wellbeing and self-rated health alongside employment status, working hours and social class and demographics (sex, age, marital status, ethnicity, highest qualification and Government Office Region).

SN 7912 <u>Quarterly Labour Force Survey, January - March, 2015:</u> <u>Unrestricted Access Teaching Dataset</u>

This teaching dataset contains a random sub-sample of the original Quarterly LFS dataset with a selection of variables covering economic activity and employment status, working hours, social class and demographics (sex, age, marital status, ethnicity, highest qualification and Government Office Region).

SN 8011 <u>Crime Survey for England and Wales, 2013-2014:</u> <u>Unrestricted Access Teaching Dataset</u>

This teaching dataset contains data for 8,843 cases from the CSEW 2013-14 (a 25 percent sample) for variables covering demographic details, perceptions of crime, experience of crime and antisocial behaviour.
